Speech Therapy Builds Confidence

Because of extensive wait lists, Nichelle thought she might not be able to find a program to help her four-year-old son Tristen with his speech-language needs. Nichelle knew how smart Tristen was, but she noticed his speech delays made it hard for others to comprehend what Tristen was saying. Nichelle feared that the delays might lead to educational, emotional and social issues in the future.

"I knew, as a mom, since Tristen was 12 months old. He would try to talk, but he just mainly wanted to stay to himself and say nothing," said Nichelle.

When she found the Center for Hearing & Speech had openings, Nichelle scheduled an appointment, and Tristen soon started working with one of the Center's speech-language pathologists. While apprehensive at first, Tristen learned to be comfortable at the Center.

Now, every Monday, Tristen gets excited to come to his appointment, and Nichelle notices how much more confident and expressive he has become. He even wants to teach his younger sister what he learns each session!

"Yesterday, I went to a wedding, and he came to the room, and he said, 'Oh, Mommy, you look so beautiful!' So that lets me know, oh my god, he's making a sentence. He is coming up with words, so I know he is improving."




A New Home for Hearing Healthcare

At three years old, while growing up in South Africa, Phillip Shifren contracted German measles, which affected hearing in his middle ear. At that time, hearing aids and other related services were not as accessible or advanced as they are today. This meant that throughout his early childhood, time in college and professional career as an accountant, Phillip had to put in extra work to communicate with others.

It was only 25-30 years ago that he was even able to get access to hearing aids.

When Phillip, now 77 years old, emigrated to Missouri in April 2023 to be closer to his three sons and seven grandchildren, he needed an audiologist. After finding the Center's website, Phillip was impressed and scheduled a visit. Once he was here, our team of expert audiologists was able to update Phillip's hearing aids and give him new insights he was unaware of. The treatment he received was so excellent that he gave us a five-star review on Google to share his experience and appreciation.

"My first appointment was with Dr. Gomez ... she gave me good advice and made me feel secure, comfortable and at home," said Phillip. "Anyone who follows in this advice (going to the Center) can only leave here happy and satisfied. Thank you."

Getting to the Root of a Challenge

When Anna Gardner's son, Raymond, was having trouble reading and writing in school, they suspected it had something to do with his speech. Since Anna worked in education, she knew how important it would be to get Raymond the help he needed because, if left untreated, speech-language delays for children can lead to potential educational, emotional and social issues that have long-term and wide-reaching impacts.

However, because of the high demand for speech services due to the COVID-19 pandemic, scheduling an appointment for Raymond was proving to be difficult.

"Before coming to the Center for Hearing & Speech, we were really having a really hard time getting an appointment for our son. And so I had phone call after phone call," said Anna.


When she found the Center, she was able to get an appointment right away, and she learned that Raymond did qualify for speech-language services. Soon, Raymond was doing sessions at the Center once a week. Our speech-language pathology (SLP) team was able to identify exactly what he was struggling with and give Raymond strategies that could be used to improve his speech.

After eight months at the Center with an SLP, Raymond completed his goals, and Anna could see how far he had progressed. One of the biggest surprises for Anna was to learn that Raymond told his teacher how much he loves to read after struggling and getting visibly frustrated with reading in the past.


"After finishing his work here, my older son has a huge new level of confidence," said Anna.

Cochlear Implants Make the Difference


As a young child, Kenneth Richardson Jr. was unaware that he was unable to hear certain sounds. This difficulty often led to tension—where even a simple activity like watching television with his family could lead to an argument because Kenneth would need the volume to be at such a high level.

These issues continued into his adulthood. His inability to hear and comprehend what was being said to him was beginning to take a toll on his family life, work and love for performing music.

"(I was) having trouble, you know, hearing certain things where people would ask certain questions, and I would just be like, 'Yeah, yeah, yeah, yeah, yeah.' And I really didn't hear what they said," Kenneth explained.

After years of being urged to have his hearing tested, Kenneth finally got a test and was told he had profound hearing loss. While searching for hearing treatment, he soon found himself at the Center, where he was told that a cochlear implant was the best option for treating his level of hearing loss. Kenneth was fitted for a cochlear implant, and it has had a dramatic effect on him and his loved ones.

"My life has changed drastically," said Kenneth. "My daughter was standing a few feet behind me, and she said, 'Daddy, can you hear me?' and I just turn immediately around and start crying ... just to hear her voice for the first time. It made me realize how much I was missing."


